OUR COUNCIL RECEIVES THE NYC HELPING HAND AWARD



The NYC Department of Small Business Services (SBS) has been sponsoring the Neighborhood Achievement Awards for the past 12 years which acknowledges individuals, small businesses, and community organizations in eight different categories “who share our commitment to building neighborhoods, creating jobs, and creating opportunities for New Yorkers.”

In 2013 they added a ninth category called The Helping Hand Award with an eye towards those who went “above and beyond for neighborhoods impacted by Hurricane Sandy.” In light of the tremendous effort that our parish community put forth to assist our neighbors in need, we submitted a nomination back in April and were notified in July that we would be one of the honorees at the awards ceremony on August 8th at the Citi Executive Conference Center in NYC.

Matt Byrne and I attended the ceremony to accept the award on behalf of our Knights of Columbus Council. Upon registering, we were given a program for the evening’s event and noticed that a photo of our council members and family loading the St. Vincent de Paul truck was one of five photos featured on the cover. As we enjoyed the hors d’oeuvres and the malted barley and wheat beverages, there were a couple of slideshows throughout the spacious room with lots of photos of people doing great things for others.

The ceremony began with several speakers and a special presentation to Chief Marty Ingram and the Point Breeze Volunteer Fire Department (in Breezy Point of course). This was followed by each honoree being called up to receive their certificate and the obligatory photo op. As we waited for our name, it was both amazing and heartwarming to listen to the brief introductions for each honoree and realize the multitude of ways that New Yorkers just did whatever it was they could to pitch in and help out.

Our Council Earns Prestigious Star Council Award

The Star Council Award recognizes outstanding achievement in membership, insurance and service program activities. To be eligible to earn the Star Council Award, a council must qualify for the Father McGivney, Founder's, and Columbian awards.



Father McGivney Award:

Achieve membership quota. The quota for councils is 7 percent increase of the council's membership as of July 1. A council must also conduct or participate in at least four First Degrees during the fraternal year.

Founder's Award: Achieve insurance membership quota. The quota for councils is a 2.5 percent net increase in insurance membership as of July 1 for the fraternal year.

Columbian Awards: Councils must conduct and report at least four major programs in each of the Service Program categories: Church, community, council, family, culture of life, and youth.


